Protect Earth is an environmental charity that plants and restores woodlands throughout the UK. We do this to create wildlife habitat, sequester carbon, and help give more people access to nature. Find out more about our work at www.protect.earth.

This woodland is known as High Wood and was acquired by Protect Earth in 2022. It is an ancient woodland, although much of it was replanted in the 1960's with conifers for timber production. For sixty years these non-native trees, like Douglas Fir, have grown rapidly to produce a dark, unnatural woodland much less favourable for wildlife than what came before. Protect Earth's aim is to return High Wood to – perhaps the most valuable of all

British woodland types – temperate rainforest.

Temperate rainforest is an incredibly rare habitat, much scarcer globally than tropical rainforest. In Britain it only occurs on the western fringes, in areas with a mild climate and the highest rainfall. Temperate rainforests are one of the most biodiverse and atmospheric habitats we have. The humid conditions creating the perfect environment for a bewildering array of mosses, lichens and epiphytic plants (plants that grow on other plants), not to mention a wide range of fungi, insects, birds, bats and mammals. High Wood is trying to turn itself back into a temperate rainforest. Look around and you will see many broadleaf trees that are naturally

regenerating amongst the conifers. But we are helping the process along by thinning the stands of conifer to allow more light back to the woodland floor. This will promote quicker and more successful colonisation by native tree species. With the help of contractors and volunteers we have already removed 1800 tonnes of conifers, and kickstarted the process further by planting nearly 1000 trees here. This includes scarce and localised species like Cornish Elm and Devon Whitebeam. As the work progresses and native species return, High Wood will become a more balanced and diverse ecosystem.

Everyone is encouraged to enjoy this woodland as the restoration process unfolds. We have installed a horse access gate, repaired mountain bike tracks and welcome dog walkers, hikers and birdwatchers. We just ask that visitors leave these woods as they find them.

Recent work parties of volunteers have maintained the planted trees, put up bird boxes, and installed steps to improve access. We now meet regularly on the 3rd weekend of each month, alternating Saturdays and Sundays. If you would like to join one of these work parties, please contact us at help@protect.earth.
