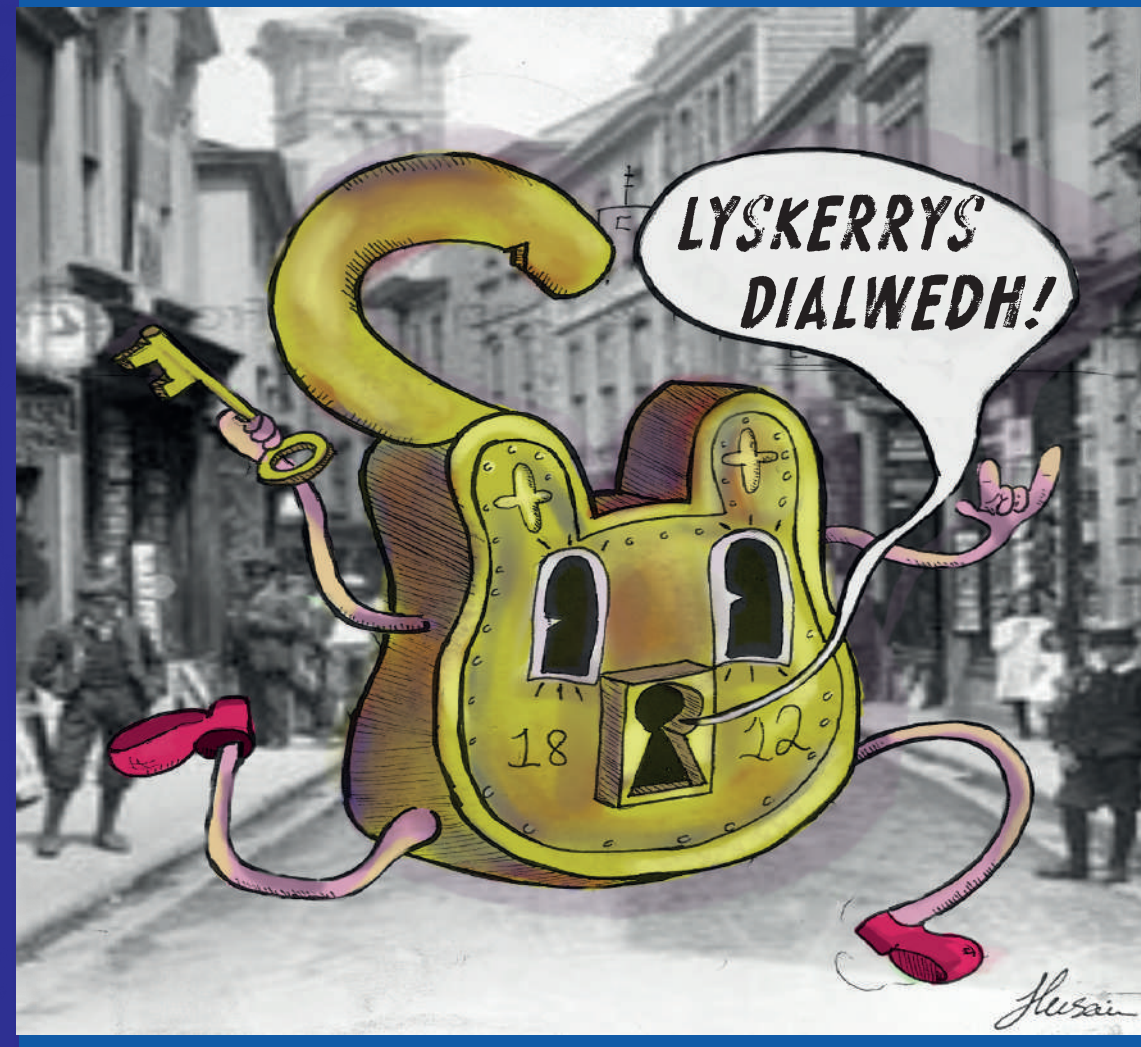


Liskeard Unlocked

Family Trail



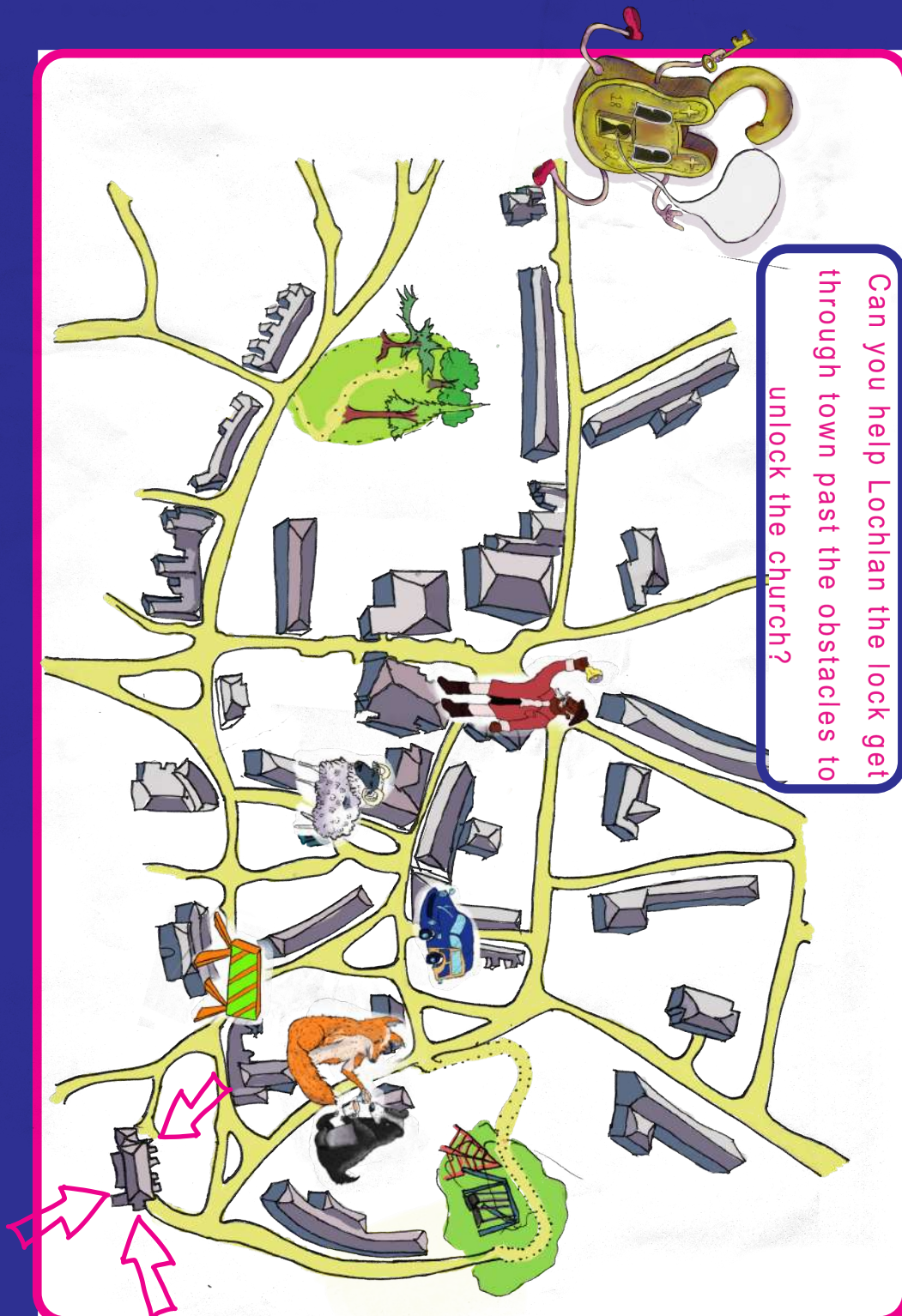
Thursday 13th-Sunday 16th September 2018

2) **Bradleys**-for how many years did Mrs Deacon run the Temperance Hotel?

3) **M&Co**-where was Mary Stanton's shop before she moved here?

4) **Painters**-in which East Anglian town were most of the Polperro Knitfrocks sold?

5) **Dunamis**-at what age did Madame Garland retire as a photographer?

6) **Pipewell**-which animals' bellies must not be washed in the Well?

7) **Leisure Lounge**-why was Market St decorated with bunting and banners 111 years ago?

8) **Wool Shop**- how many Barrett sisters were involved in the hat and bonnet making business in 1851?

9) **Museum**-the mile markers outside the Museum show the distance from which quay in Looe?

Hats Off to Liskeard's Women Workers

The national theme for Heritage Open Days is women and power, to mark 100 years since many women got the vote. Locally we've been finding out about women who worked and ran businesses in the town. As part of Hats Off, children at Hillfort and St Martin's schools have made puppets and told the women's stories and their work will be on display at Liskeard Unlocked. On Saturday 15 September there will be storytelling around the town. There will also be a trail of six buildings connected with the women, with posters and other displays and activities, including gansey knitting and hat making.

The Hats Off Project was made possible by a FEAST grant and match funding from Liskeard Town Council and Cornwall Councillors Nick Craker, Sally Hawken and Jane Pascoe.



The six buildings are:

The Wool Shop (Pike Street) - close to the former shop and family home of the Barrett sisters, straw hat and bonnet makers.

The Leisure Lounge (Market Street) - location of Alice Matthews printing and stationary business.

Dunamis bookshop (Fore Street) - home of 'Madame' Eliza Garland's photography studio.

Affina (Fore Street) - former Yarmouth Stores which worked with the contract gansey knitters from Polperro. Display in nearby Painters craft shop and a chance to try gansey knitting on Saturday 2-4pm.

M & Co (Fore Street) - former site of Mary Stanton's draper's shop.

Bradleys (Bay Tree Hill) - previously the Temperance Hotel run by Susan Deacon and her husband.
